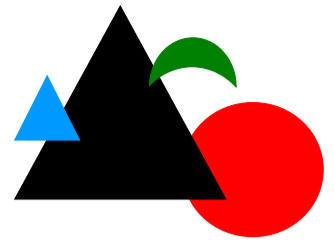


Manipulative Visual Language (MVL) Workshop



What is MVL?

MVL is an innovative system which presents the rules of grammar visually. It enables students to see, touch, and manipulate parts of grammar using colourful, appealing shapes. MVL is an easy to use tool that assists teachers in teaching English grammar in conjunction with their existing curriculum. MVL can be used with ALL students in grades k-12 including pre-school students, English Language Learners, Deaf and hard of hearing students, even college students.



How does MVL work?

MVL takes the basic parts of grammar and presents them in the form of visually appealing 3-D wood or plastic blocks that can be manipulated by the teacher and student. Correct grammar structure is presented visually in the form of sentence "maps" that enable students to follow logical patterns of sentence formation.

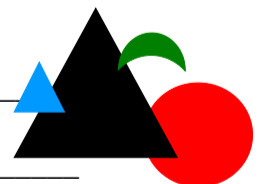
